More specifically, the humanities explore where we have been (history, art, literature), where we are going (cultural, moral, and philosophical trends), and who we are (universal human nature).

## **HUMANITIES CAPSTONE**

Seniors take a capstone course where you will choose a topic that you're interested in. Then you'll research that topic in depth and present your findings in a scholarly forum.

The humanities major will help you understand and engage with your culture.

Because of the increasing speed of cultural change, you need a deep understanding of the past. Studying the humanities will help you gain that sense of the history of ideas.

As a humanities student, you'll explore not just the "what" of culture, but also the "why." You'll explore difficult ethical questions. You'll discuss how people make sense out of life by using stories. You'll become a deeper thinker and a more articulate writer. And you'll become equipped to impact this culture with truth.
