ACADEMIC REGALIA

SIGNIFICANCE

THE CAP is the mortar board for undergraduate and master's degree candidates; doctoral degree candidates may wear a tam. The tassel color indicates the field of study for the degree being awarded.

THE GOWN is traditionally black. The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves. The gown for the master's degree has an oblong sleeve, open at the wrist. The sleeve base hangs down in the traditional manner. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut, and the front part has an arc cut away. The gown for the doctor's degree has bell-shaped sleeves. Gowns for the bachelor's or master's degrees are untrimmed. For the doctoral degree, the gown is faced down the front with velvet. These panels may be either black or the color that symbolizes the subject field in which the degree was earned. Maranatha's gowns are all black.

HONOR CORDS are worn by graduating seniors receiving honors based upon their cumulative grade point average.

THE HOOD is worn by master's and doctoral degree candidates and varies in length for each degree. The hood's lining symbolizes the academic colors of the college or university where the degree was earned. The hood is trimmed or edged in a border of velvet which varies in width for the master's and doctor's degree. The border color represents the field of study in which the degree was awarded.

The president and members of the governing body of a college or university are entitled to wear doctors' gowns, even if they do not hold the doctor's degree; but their hoods represent only degrees actually held by the wearers.

THE GONFALON, or banners, that precedes each school, college, or department in the Commencement ceremony have their origins in medieval Florence, where they represented each gonfalon, or community. Since then, they have become a part of the pageantry associated with college and university ceremonies worldwide. The color of the two outer panels on each of the smaller gonfalons coincides with that college's, school's, or department's tassel color. The Maranatha Baptist University gonfalon is larger with gold side panels.

THE CEREMONIAL MACE, carried by an honored faculty member or professor emeritus before the presidential entourage, also has medieval origins, as it was carried by the sergeant at arms to protect the monarch. It is currently a symbol of authority in colleges and universities around the world. The seals of Maranatha Baptist University and Maranatha Baptist Bible College adorn the head of the mace.

We praise God for the impact MBU graduates are consistently making for the cause of Christ at home and around the world! Ever since the founding of Maranatha, the world has grown darker, and the case for higher Christian education that our founder Dr. B. Myron Cedarholm so faithfully taught has never been greater.

MBU provides a Christ-centered, biblically based liberal arts education and ministry training in an environment rich in academic opportunity and spiritual investment. The university currently offers 30 bachelor's degree programs and eight associate programs. Beyond the bachelor's level, MBU offers four graduate programs in Business and Education. Additionally, Maranatha Baptist Seminary offers six graduate degrees, including the Master of Divinity and the Doctor of Ministry. Dual degree pathways allow students the possibility of completing both a bachelor's degree and a master's degree simultaneously.

In January 2019, Maranatha unveiled Maranatha Baptist Bible Institute, which is specifically geared for the student who is not presently interested in pursuing a college degree, but who desires to gain solid, comprehensive Bible knowledge and practical ministry experience. The institute offers two very affordable tracks: a oneyear diploma program or a two-year certificate program. We now have a gateway from the Bible Institute to the Associates Degree in Christian Ministry. This year, five graduates completed the two-year cycle and are receiving their certificates. Additionally, one student has completed the requirements for the one-year diploma program.

Maranatha's recent graduates have excelled in their major field and licensure examinations. The School of Nursing completed the NCLEX exam with a 100% first-time pass rate. The School of Business graduates ranked in the top 8% of senior business majors nationwide, while the Department of Music graduates scored in the top 1% among their peers this year.

This year, the Music and Humanities Departments presented "Founding Faith, Future Faithfulness", a program reflecting on God's mighty work in the founding of our school as well as a forward vision for our future. In December, the Department of Humanities presented Dicken's classic *A Christmas Carol*, and in the spring, entertained audiences with the light-hearted mystery, *Seven Keys to Baldpate*.

The Department of Music programmed 15 student recitals, the Great Lakes Music Festival, Classical Kids Concert, Music on Mondays Chamber Music Series, Artist Series, and the Budahl Tribute Concert. All three choirs ministered in area churches, Chamber Singers and Madrigal Choir took extensive tours, and the Symphonic Band traveled to Michigan for their Fall tour. Maranatha Online continues to extend the reach of MBU by providing Christ-centered educational opportunities to students located around the globe. Over 200 undergraduate and graduate courses are offered throughout the year in both online and virtual formats. More than twenty degree programs are now offered entirely online. Each semester, students from across the country and around the world participate in MBU campus courses through the use of video-conferencing software.

Over the last 10 years, hundreds of high school students have benefited from the MBU High School Scholarship to earn college credit through online and virtual courses. In addition, MBU partners with Christian high schools to offer dual credit through the Advance to College program.

MBU is committed to offering affordable online options to high school, undergraduate, and graduate students. The Ignite Scholarship is awarded to adult learners with financial need who are enrolled in one of MBU's ten 100% online undergraduate degree programs. The Teaching and Leading Scholarship is awarded to graduate students who are in full-time Christian ministry and home educators.

The Sabercats sent three teams to the NCCAA DII National Championships during the 2022-23 seasons. Women's Volleyball won the NCCAA North Region, qualifying them for the National Tournament. Mattie Bumpus was named the NCCAA DII Women's Volleyball North Region and National Player of the Year for the second year in a row (the 8th MBU Women's Volleyball recipient of the national award since 2010). Both Men's and Women's Cross Country gualified for the NCCAA National Championships, where Jeremy Fopma repeated his 2019, 2020, & 2021 performances by becoming the 2022 NCCAA DII Men's Cross Country National Champion and All-American. Jeremy broke his own three-time record, repeating the feat as the first runner in MBU and NCCAA history crowned as a four-time NCCAA National Champion! Maranatha had 12 student-athletes named to NCCAA All-Region teams. 4 student-athletes earn NCCAA All-American. and 24 NCCAA Scholar Athlete honors in 2022-23. We also saw two athletes recognized as AVCA All-Americans. Regina DeLozier (Women's Volleyball) and John Warnke (Men's Cross Country) were named the NCCAA North Region Coach of the Year in their respective sport. As we reflect on what the Lord has allowed us to accomplish this year. we press forward to greater impact for His glory. We look forward to new programs, new ministries, and new opportunities that lead each of us to greater likeness to Him.

Maranatha! He is coming! May we be faithful until He comes.
