ACADEMIC REGALIA

SIGNIFICANCE

THE CAP is the mortar board for undergraduate and master's degree candidates; doctoral degree candidates may wear a tam. The tassel color indicates the field of study for the degree being awarded.

Blue and Gold - Bible Institute Apricot - Nursing Drab - Business Pink - Music Yellow Gold - Applied Science Scarlet - Theology or Divinity Gold - Interdisciplinary

Light Blue - Education White - Humanities Gold - Doctorate

THE GOWN is traditionally black. Bachelor's or master's degree gowns are untrimmed. Doctoral gowns are faced down the front with velvet, either black or the color that symbolizes the subject field in which the degree was earned. Maranatha's gowns are all black.

THE HOOD is worn by master's and doctoral degree candidates and varies in length for each degree. Its lining represents the school's academic colors, and the velvet trim varies in width for master's and doctoral degrees. The border color represents the field of study in which the degree was awarded.

The president and members of the governing body of a college or university are entitled to wear doctoral gowns, even if they do not hold the degree: their hoods represent their earned degrees.

THE CEREMONIAL MACE, carried by an honored faculty member or professor emeritus before the presidential entourage, is a symbol of authority in colleges and universities around the world. The seals of Maranatha Baptist University and Maranatha Baptist Bible College adorn the head of the mace.

We praise God for the impact MBU graduates are consistently making for the cause of Christ at home and around the world! Ever since the founding of Maranatha, the world has grown darker, and the case for higher Christian education that our founder Dr. B. Myron Cedarholm so faithfully taught has never been greater.

MBU provides a Christ-centered, biblically based liberal arts education and ministry training in an environment rich in academic opportunity and spiritual investment. The university currently offers twenty-six bachelor's degree programs and eight associate programs. Beyond the bachelor's level, MBU offers four graduate programs in Business and Education. Additionally, Maranatha Baptist Seminary offers six graduate degrees, including the Master of Divinity and the Doctor of Ministry. Dual degree pathways allow students the possibility of completing both a bachelor's degree and a master's degree simultaneously.

In January 2019, Maranatha unveiled Maranatha Baptist Bible Institute, which is specifically geared for the student who is not presently interested in pursuing a college degree, but who desires to gain solid, comprehensive Bible knowledge and practical ministry experience. The institute offers two very affordable tracks: a one-year diploma program or a two-year certificate program. We now have a gateway from the Bible Institute to the Associates Degree in Christian Ministry. This year six graduates completed the two-year cycle and are receiving their certificates. Additionally, one student has completed the requirements for the one-year diploma program.

Maranatha's recent graduates have excelled in their major field and licensure examinations. The School of Nursing completed the NCLEX exam with a 100% first-time pass rate. The School of Business graduates ranked in the top 9% of senior business majors nationwide, while the Department of Music graduates scored in the top 1% among their peers this year.

In December, the Music Department presented a major performance of Handel's *MESSIAH*. The Madrigal Choir, Chamber Singers, and Orchestra were joined by the Chorale and the MBU Academy choir, while the solos were sung by students and faculty. In the fall, the Humanities Department presented *The Matchmaker* by Thorton Wilder, and in the spring entertained audiences with the timeless classic *The Sound of Music* with a pit orchestra.

Over the school year, the Music Department programmed 12 student recitals, Great Lakes Music Festival, Classical Kids Concert, Music on Mondays Chamber Music Series, and Artist Series, in addition to studio recitals and performing group concerts. Chorale ministered in area churches, Chamber Singers and Madrigal Choir took extensive tours, and the Symphonic Band traveled to Missouri for their Fall tour. Each of the traveling groups conducted high school music festivals (one each in Wisconsin, Missouri, and Michigan). Of course, a major part of studentmusicians' lives is ministry in campus chapels and in local churches. Maranatha Online continues to extend the reach of MBU by providing Christ-centered educational opportunities to students located around the globe. Over 200 undergraduate and graduate courses are offered throughout the year in both online and virtual formats, and more than twenty degree programs are now offered entirely online. Each semester, students from across the country and around the world participate in MBU campus courses through the use of video-conferencing software.

Over the last 10 years, hundreds of high school students have benefited from the MBU High School Scholarship to earn college credit through online and virtual courses. In addition, MBU partners with Christian high schools to offer dual credit through the Advance to College program.

MBU is committed to offering affordable online options to high school, undergraduate, and graduate students. The Ignite Scholarship is awarded to adult learners with financial need who are enrolled in one of MBU's ten 100% online undergraduate degree programs. The Teaching and Leading Scholarship is awarded to graduate students who are in full-time Christian ministry and home educators.

In the spring of 2024, MBU launched MaranathaPlus, a learning platform for non-degree seeking adults. MPLUS is designed to provide low-cost, professional, spiritual, and personal growth opportunities in a selfpaced format. The catalog opened with nine courses, such as Christian Worldview, New Testament 1, Expository Teaching for Women, and Baptist Distinctives. Many of the classes are offered in both an individual format and in a format designed for churches to use in classroom settings. Additional course offerings are in development and will be available in the fall.

The Sabercats sent two teams to the NCCAA DII National Championships during the 2023-24 season. The Women's and Men's Cross Country teams won the NCCAA Midwest/North 'Super' Region, having qualified all runners for the National Tournament. At Nationals, the men's team finished as NCCAA DII National runner-up. Runners Natalie Shetter and Anna Morken were named NCCAA All-Americans and helped the ladies finish fourth at the National tournament. Volleyball standout, Emily Johnson, was named Most Valuable Player of the Midwest region and is now the all-time record holder in career assists for Maranatha Women's Volleyball. Maranatha had 18 student-athletes named to NCCAA All-Region teams, four student-athletes earned NCCAA All-American, and 25 NCCAA Scholar-Athlete honors in 2023-24. Halv Hendricks (Men's and Women's Cross Country) was named the NCCAA Midwest/North Region Coach of the Year. Baseball and softball awards have not vet been determined. Pitcher, Joe Anderson, set an MBU record with 17 strikeouts in a single game during our home-opener series.

As we reflect on what the Lord has allowed us to accomplish this year, we press forward to greater impact for His glory. We look forward to new programs, new ministries, and new opportunities that lead each of us to greater likeness to Him.

Maranatha! He is coming! May we be faithful until He comes.
